1. Introduction

The Global Conference for Multidisciplinary Research 2026 (GCMR), organized by Achievers International Campus, respects and is committed to protecting intellectual property rights and complying with applicable copyright and intellectual property laws.

This Copyright Policy outlines the ownership, permitted use, and protection of content published through the GCMR website and related conference materials. It also establishes the responsibilities of authors, contributors, and users in relation to copyrighted and third-party materials.

By accessing or using the GCMR website, users agree to comply with the terms set out in this policy.

- Required permissions have been obtained before submission.
- The submission does not knowingly infringe the intellectual property rights of another individual, institution, publisher, organization, or other rights holder.
- Any licensing conditions associated with third-party materials are observed.
- Permission documentation can be provided to GCMR if requested.
- Where third-party content is incorporated into a submission, authors may be required to provide evidence of permission or an applicable license.

6. Third-Party Copyrighted Material

- Authors and contributors may wish to include material created by third parties, such as:
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 - Diagrams and illustrations
 - Figures and tables
 - Maps
 - Charts and graphs
 - Screenshots
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 - Extracts from books, articles, or reports
 - Audio and video materials
- Such material remains the property of its respective copyright holder unless otherwise stated.
- The responsibility for determining whether permission is required and obtaining the necessary authorization rests with the author or contributor using the material.
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7. Openly Licensed and Public-Domain Materials

- Materials made available under open licences or identified as being in the public domain may be used subject to the conditions of the relevant licence or applicable law.
- Authors are responsible for reviewing the terms of any licence before

incorporating such material into their submissions. Where attribution is required, appropriate attribution must be provided.

8. Research Papers and Conference Publications

- Submission of a research paper or other academic work to GCMR does not automatically transfer ownership of the author's intellectual property to GCMR unless a separate agreement expressly provides otherwise.
- Authors should review any applicable publication, licensing, consent, or copyright agreement associated with their submission.
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- Authors retain responsibility for ensuring that their work can lawfully be submitted and made available under those terms.

9. Moral Rights and Attribution

GCMR recognizes the importance of appropriate authorship and attribution.
